4-Month Compliance / 180 Day Review Form

How do I get 4 month compliance/180 day review

- You must know your IID end date; it is your responsibility to confirm your IID end date with the DOL. This can be found on your notice of suspension, an email from CustomerCare@dol.wa.gov, or check status on DOL website www.dol.wa.gov by clicking on "Learn how to reinstate your driver license". You may also call DOL Call Center (360) 902-3900.
- Return to Smart Start service center for log file download on or after IID end date.
- After log file download contact Smart Start corporate office and request 4month compliance review. You may request by phone 800-880-3394 or email waremoval@smartstartinc.com (If email request be sure to include full legal name, date of birth, IID end date and contact phone number)
- Smart Start may take 3-5 business days to finish review. Smart Start will contact you with review results.

Restricted Drivers Subject to Compliance Based Removal:

- Only subjects convicted of a DUI offense in 2011 and there after
 - * Driver restrictions of one, five and ten year's periods
- Subjects with a previous Negligent Driving or Reckless Driving offense who receive a subsequent reduced DUI conviction.
 - * Must have an ignition interlock for six months subject to compliance based removal

What constitutes an extension under RCW 46.20.720 Section (4) Parts a, b, c & d

- Any attempt to **start** the vehicle with a breath alcohol concentration of **.040** or more.
- Failure to take any random test.
- Failure to pass any random retest with a breath alcohol concentration of 0.025 or lower.
- Failure of the person to appear at the ignition interlock device vendor when required for maintenance, repair, calibration, monitoring, inspection, or replacement of the device.
- In the event an incident is found a four month/180 day extension shall be added from date of incident.

Any incidents found on database during the last four months or 180 days of the IID restriction are not subject to interpretation by ignition interlock vendors. Smart Start will not interpret alcohol failures. If the ignition interlock indicates **any** alcohol failure of .040 BrAC or above on startup or .025 BrAC and above on a retest the restricted driver is in violation of RCW 46.20.720.
